

CM Blog Borders

Published on September 20, 2021



- **Step 1**: Cut a piece of marigold dots tonal paper to measure $2-1/2 \times 12$ " for the base of the border.
- Step 2: Cut a piece of cardstock (any shade you won't see it) to measure 2-1/4 x 12".
- **Step 3**: Cut seven pieces of various papers to measure $4 \times 1-3/4$ ". Adhere to the cardstock at an angle. Trim any excess with a scissors.
- Step 4: Adhere the piece of cardstock with angled pieces to the border.
- **Step 5:** Using Sunflower Vine Border Punch, punch a border from Goldenrod Solid Cardstock. Adhere to the left edge of the border.
- **Step 6**: Cut a piece of burnt orange cable knit sweater designer paper to measure $3/4 \times 12$ ". Adhere to the top-left edge of the cardstock piece of the border as shown.
- Step 7: Run your fingernail along the some of the edges of the papers to distress.
- Step 8: Adhere stickers and embellishments, using Foam Squares on some for added dimension.





Published on June 29, 2020

- Step 1: Cut a piece of White Cardstock to measure 2 x 12".
- **Step 2**: Using the Camera Love Punch, punch 18 (or more) camera pieces. Adhere on the White Cardstock sporadically. Trim off any excess using a scissors.
- **Step 3**: Cut a piece of blue patterned paper to measure $2-1/4 \times 12$ ". Adhere behind the White Cardstock.
- **Step 4:** Cut a piece of Black Cardstock, using the 12-inch Trimmer with the Stamping Blade to measure 2-3/4 x 12". Adhere behind the blue piece.
- **Step 5:** Using the inside of the Custom Cutting System Gemstone Pattern with the Red Blade, cut a piece from the dark blue patterned paper. Adhere the sticker to the top using Foam Squares. Adhere this piece to the top right portion of the border.
- **Step 6:** Using the inside of the Custom Cutting System Gemstone Pattern with the Red Blade, cut three hexagons from various patterns of paper. Off-set and adhere from behind the border.

Step 1: Using the 12-inch Trimmer with the Scallop Blade, cut a $12 \times 2-3/4$ " strip of ocean blue trellis designer paper for the base.

Step 2: Cut a 12 x 2-1/4" strip of cardstock (any shade). Cut six 3/8 x 12" strips of various designer papers. Adhere side by side along the cardstock strip. Using the Anchor Punch, punch five times at regular intervals across the strip (save the anchors punched out for another project.

Step 3: Adhere the strip to the base using Foam Squares for added dimension.
