

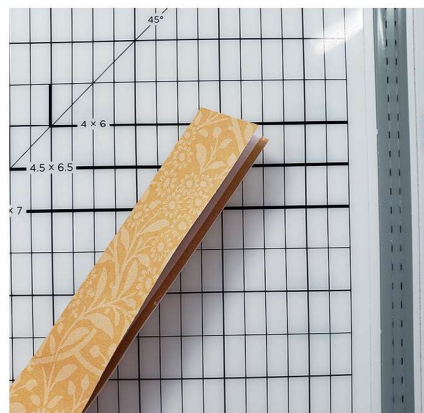


Bold Chevrons

Bold chunks of color provide a stunning background for this two-page layout. Made with 2 inch strips of paper, this is a great design to use up those final scraps of your collection. Be sure to take you time with the drawing of the pencil lines - those are your guides to placing the chevrons.



1. Trim paper to 2x12 inch strips. Each strip makes 5 chevrons. You need 24 chevrons to make the design, (plus two for title clusters.)



2. Fold each strip in half.



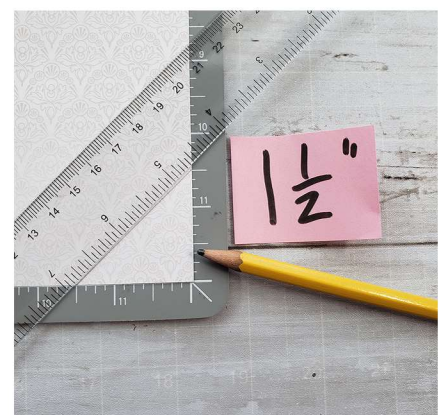
3. With the folded edge of the strip on the 45° line, trim off the corner of the paper to start the first chevron.



4. Trim each chevron to 1.5 inches.



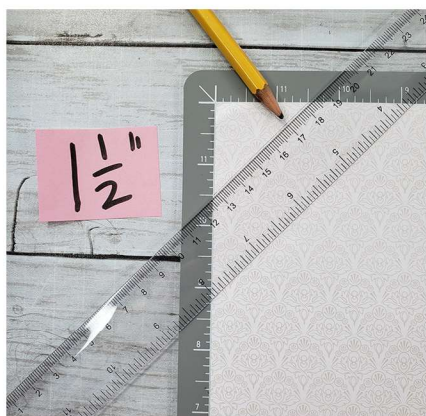
5. You will need approximately 24 chevrons for the design. Depending on your pattern you may need to cut additional strips.



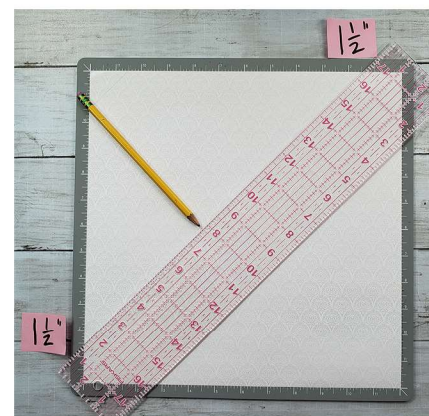
6. For the LEFT page, draw a light pencil line on the LOWER RIGHT corner from 1.5 to 1.5 inches.



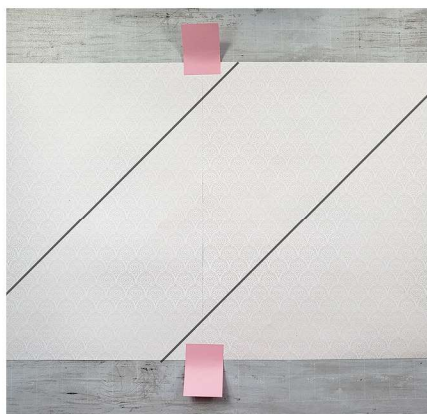
7. On the LEFT page, draw a line connecting 1.5 inches from the top right to 1.5 inches from the lower left.



8. On the RIGHT page, draw a light pencil line from 1.5 to 1.5 across the UPPER LEFT corner.



9. on the RIGHT page, draw a light pencil line to from 1.5 inches up from the lower left to 1.5 inches from the top right.



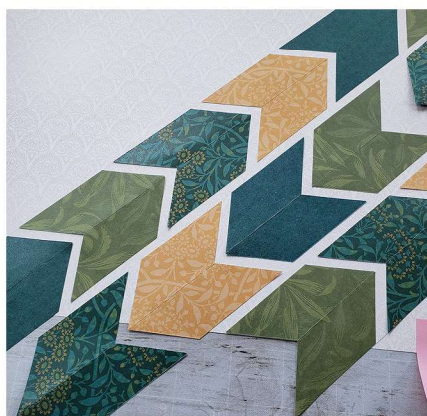
10. You will have two parallel lines (digital enhancement to show the lines.) Use post it notes to hold the two pages together.



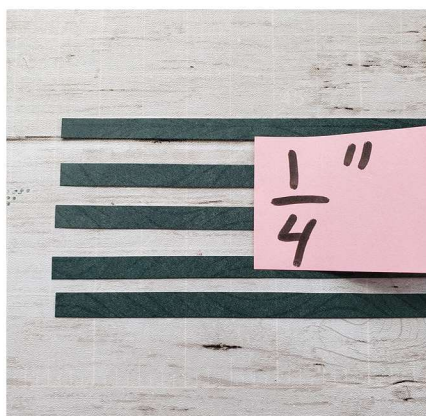
11. Apply the first chevrons as shown. I suggest repo adhesive. For any chevron that crosses the page break, use a liberal amount of adhesive. Maintain about a 3/16th inch separation.



12. After applying all of the right side row, apply the left side row.



13. finish by applying the middle row. This will allow you to center the middle pieces.



14. Cut 5 strips to 1/4 x 12 inches. Use four to create the borders. Use the 5th piece to piece in the smaller sections.



15. use left over chevrons to create title clusters with stickers and embellishments.
