

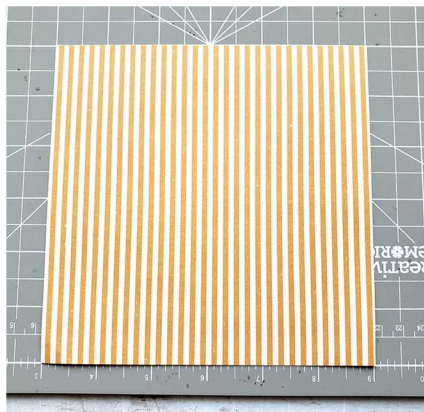


### Jumbo Swell

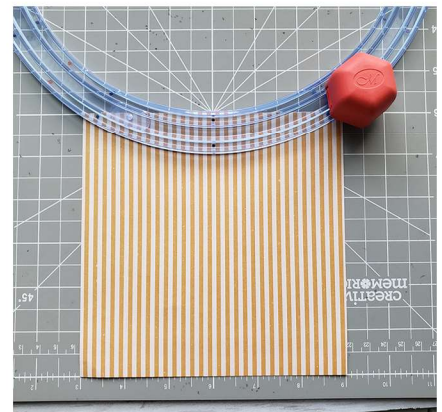
This page is heavily inspired by a page I saw by a Japanese Advisor on Instagram. It uses the Jumbo Circle Template to create a large swell across the page. I love this shape and am so happy to let my tools do the cutting work for me!



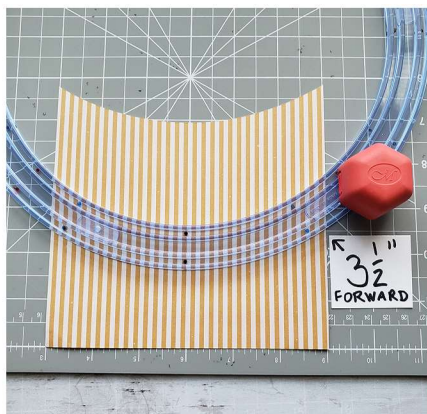
1. Trim a piece of decorative paper to 6x12 and then cut half to make two 6x6 squares.



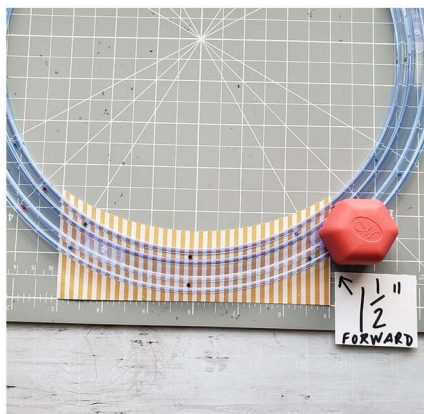
2. Stack the squares on top of each other, making sure that any directional prints are lined up going the same way. Center the squares on the 6 inch line of the trimmer mat.



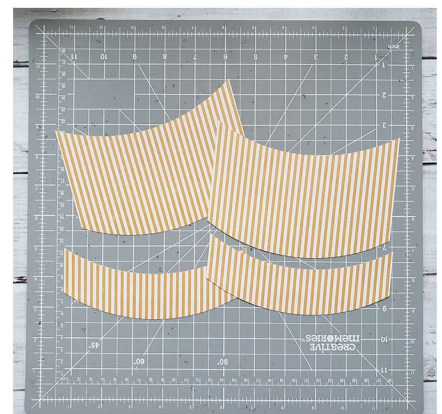
3. Center the Jumbo circle across the top and cut a curve with the red blade on the outside track.



4. Move your Jumbo Circle about 3.5 inches towards you (use the lines on the mat to guide you) and trim again with red blade on outside track.



5. Move the Jumbo Circle about 1.5 inches forward and trim a final curve with the red blade on the outside track.



6. You will end up with two pairs of curved paper.



7. Adhere the two wider curves as shown - line up the right edge at 6 inches.



8. Layer on the thinner curves next - you can overlap the wider curves a bit if they don't fit snug.



9. Add photos and embellishments as desired. I show three 5.75x4.75 photos and one vertical 3x5.

Note about pattern selection for this project: There is a definite seam in the middle of this swell where the two pieces meet. My recommendation is to use patterns that are not big and chunky, but smaller so that the seams are more easily hid. The photo placement can also help with covering the seam. Any striped pattern paper is likely better going horizontal rather than vertical.
