

Quarter Circle Layout

Shown with the Happy Camper collection (retired.)





SUPPLY LIST:

- 2-3 sheets of coordinating papers a mix of designer and cardstock
- Various scraps of designer paper or cardstock to make circles
- CCS Circle Pattern #3 (largest)
- Green CCS Blade
- 12-inch Trimmer
- T-Square or Ruler
- 13x13" Cutting Mat
- Respositionable Adhesive



1. Make 8 circles with Circle #3 and the green blade on inside track



2. Rest the circle in lower end of the "gutter" of the trimmer and trim each circle in half.



3. Trim each half circle in two by lining up at 4cm. You will have 16 quarter circles.



4. Trim tonal paper to 10-1/4" square.



5. Create mat with 10-5/8" square. Trim a 1" frame if desired for extra cardstock to mat photos.



6. Create photo mat before arranging quarter circles. This will help with placement of circles as you build page. My sample is (2) 3-1/2 x 5" photos. I trimmed mat down from the center piece made in step 5.



7. Center tonal paper on mat (corners line up with 45° angle lines.) Dry fit pieces as shown using 6 inch line as center auide.



8. Lay down photo mat to help determine how to place final pieces. Adhere all pieces then mount to the brown mat made in step 6. Attach to 12x12 paper.

Additional Notes: The 8 original circles will not cover the entire paper. If you are not using a large photo mat, you will need to cut 9 circles to be able to fill the entire square made in step 4. The quarter circles are placed approximately 1/8" from the edge of the paper and there is roughly a 1/8" spacing between each piece. Repositionable adhesive is a MUST for this layout.
