

Scrap Facebook Live with Meggan Jacks

Interlocking Zig Zag Paper Strips




1. Trim a piece of designer paper and a coordinating cardstock to 6 x 12". Score the designer paper every 3". Score the cardstock at 1-1/2", 4-1/2", 7-1/2" and 11-1/2". Accordion fold both pieces.



2. Place the designer paper on the 45° line and trim off the corner. Move the paper to the right to line up at the 1" line and cut. Repeat to make a second strip.



3. Place the cardstock on the 45° line and cut off the corner. Move the paper over the 1/2" line and trim. Repeat to make a second strip.




4. Pair up the zig-zags as shown and adhere the designer paper on top of the cardstock.



5. "Twist" the paper around each other (see video.) Flip over and place adhesive down on the middle section of the combined border.



6. Adhere the border to the paper where desired.



7. On the TOP row of designer "peaks" snip every other one that crosses a cardstock piece. Tuck snipped ends under the cardstock.

FINISHING THE LAYOUT

Use the remaining 6 x 12" piece of cardstock as a large mat for (3) 3-3/4 x 6" photos.

Use the remaining triangles from the designer paper as accent pieces.

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
