

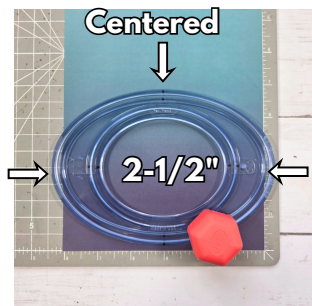


SUPPLIES

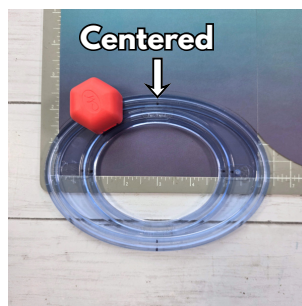
- 1 sheet of Gradient Paper (Any color)
- 1 sheet of coordinating cardstock for base page
- Cardstock for mats
- Ovals CCS Patterns w/Red CCS Blade
- 13x13" Cutting Mat
- 12" Trimmer
- Repositionable Adhesive
- Embellishments as desired



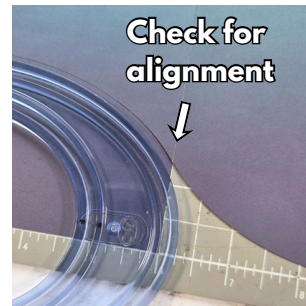
STEP 1: Cut the gradient paper in half vertically to create two 6 x 12" rectangles.



STEP 2: Center the largest oval pattern at the bottom of the right rectangle. The horizontal center of the oval pattern should be 2-1/2" from the bottom. Use the red blade on the outside track to cut the bottom of the paper



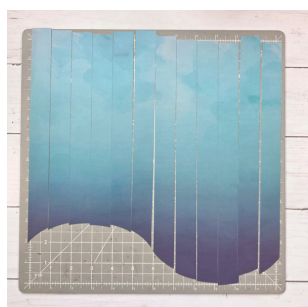
STEP 3: Lay the left rectangle next to the right one so that the tops of the papers line up. Center the largest oval pattern on the rectangle as shown, with the horizontal center of the oval pattern ~1/4" from the bottom.



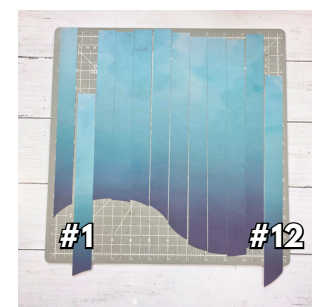
STEP 4: Before cutting, double check that the line will match up with the curve of the right rectangle. It doesn't have to be perfect, but it should be close. Then cut with the red CCS blade on the outside track.



STEP 5: The papers two pieces will look like this when placed side by side. The top edges remain uncut.



STEP 6: Cut each 6 x 12" piece into 1" strips. Keep the strips in order as you cut them. *Optional: use post-it notes to number them 1-12.*



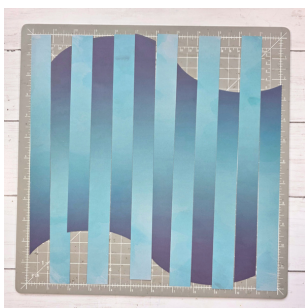
STEP 7: Select strips 2 and 12 - **SWAP** their positions and **ROTATE** them 180 degrees so that the uncut edge is at the bottom of the cutting mat.



STEP 8: Repeat Step 7 with strips 4 and 10.



STEP 9: Repeat again with strips 6 and 8.



STEP 10: Adhere the strips to the base paper, starting with the center pieces and working to the outside.

Finishing the layout

1. Cut (3) 4-1/2" square mats from cardstock and pair with 4" sq photos.
2. Trim a 12" border element in half and tuck behind the center photo as shown.
3. Add embellishments and pen details as desired.
